HAND PRINTING

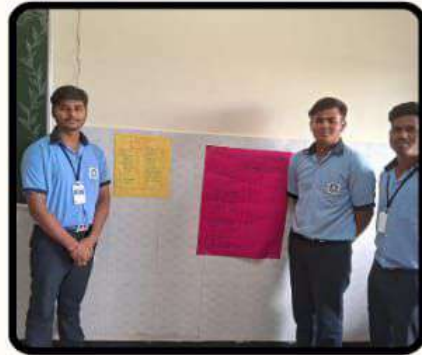

FRUIT DECO



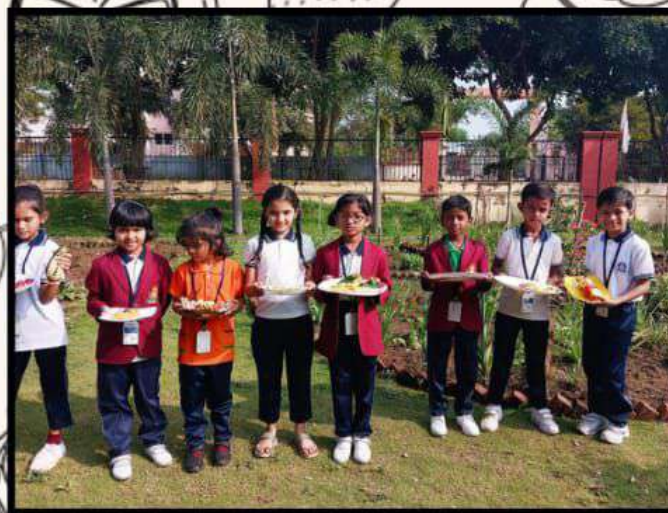

CHILDREN'S DAY



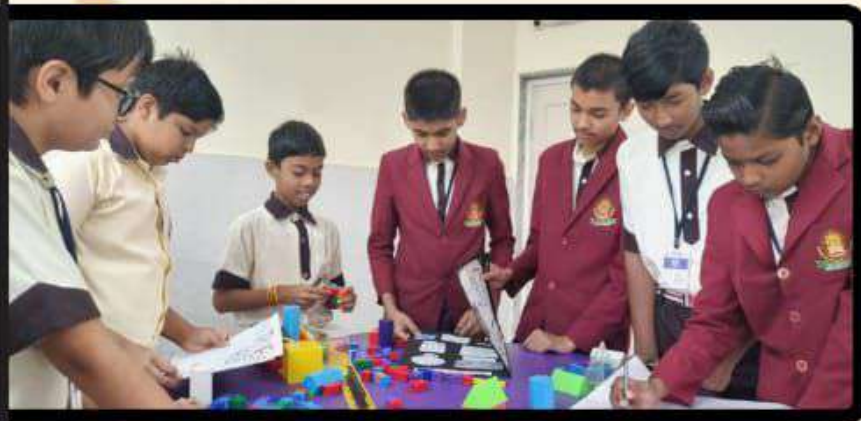

BMSSS are organised career guidance for classes 8th and 9th grade students, recognising the importance of dear goals.

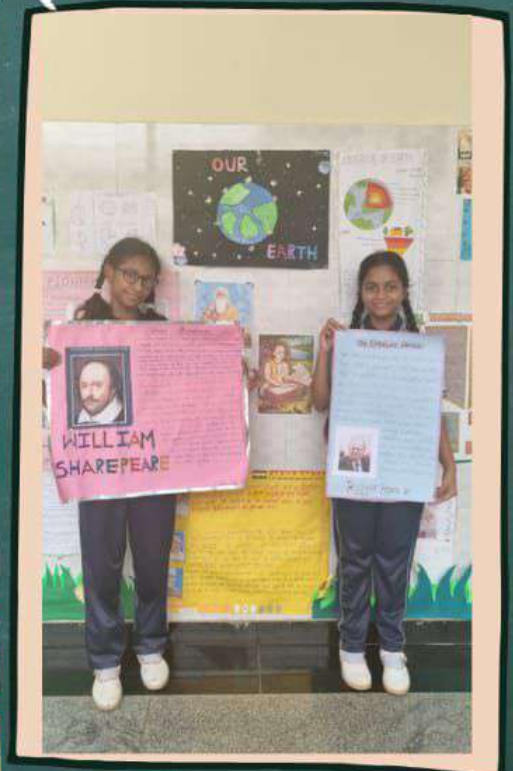

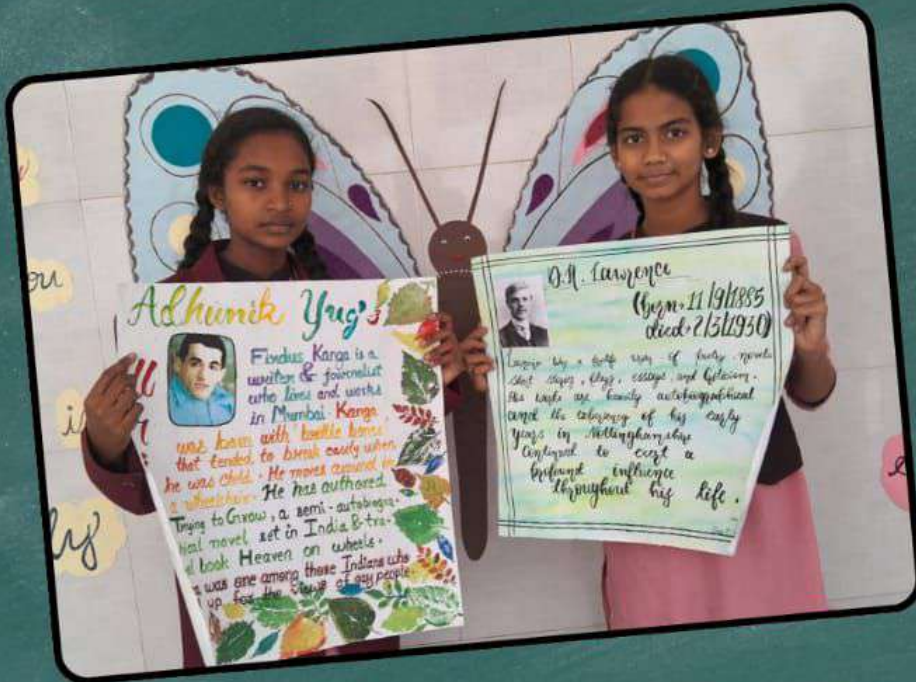
HONOURING THE EMINENT WRITERS

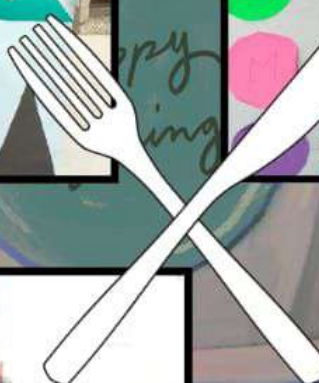

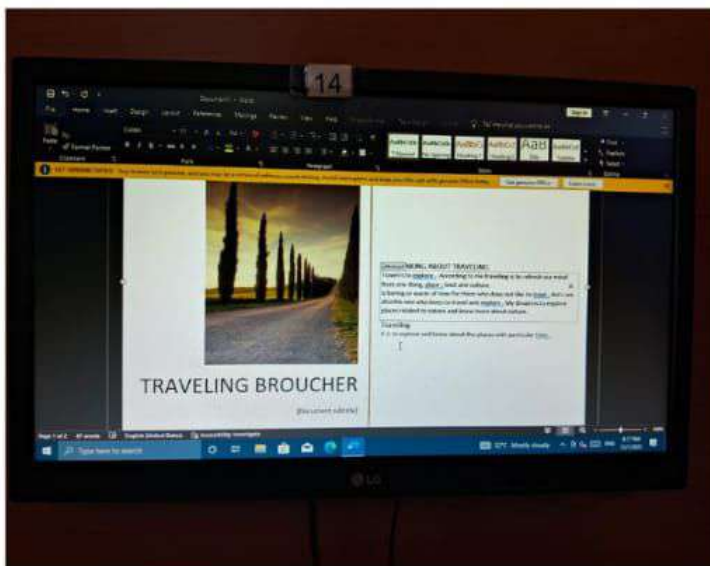
The visually appealing and delicious creations delighted both the eyes and taste buds.
